Shipyard Export **\$5**
Portland, ME

A blonde ale with enough hops to balance its malty sweetness, it's the classic accompaniment to a lobster dinner.

Shipyard Prelude **\$6**
Portland, ME

This winter warmer has a rich nutty malt flavor with a bushel of earthy English hops and a bit of extra alcohol to keep out the chill.

Shipyard Old Thumper **\$6**
Portland, ME

An English style ESB, Old Thumper has a light malty sweetness and a subtle fruity aroma that make it a smooth drinker.

Allagash White **\$7**
Portland, ME

Maine's take on a Belgian witbier, the white is light in color but firmer than a light lager and is subtly spicy, with notes of coriander and citrus.

Allagash Black (750 ml) **\$18**
Portland, ME

This unorthodox Belgian stout, mixes barley, wheat, and oats for a dark, rich, beer with a touch of boozy warmth.

Peak Organic Winter Session **\$6**
Portland, ME

A winter wheat beer flavored with dark, toasty malts. Local Citra hops give a note of pineapple to this easy drinker.

Peak Organic IPA **\$6**
Portland, ME

Brewed with three fragrant American hops, this medium-bodied IPA has a hoppy aroma but is not overly bitter.

Geary's Pale Ale **\$6**
Portland, ME

A classic British Pale Ale made on the other side of the Atlantic, it's crisp, medium bodied and hoppy.

Belfast Bay Lobster Ale **\$6**
Belfast, ME

A medium-bodied red ale that has subtle toasty and fruity flavors, and is hoppy but not overwhelming.

McGovern's Oatmeal Stout **\$6**
Belfast, ME

A dark, rich, smooth ale with caramel and chocolate flavors. Perfect for winter alongside a bread bowl of chowda.
